Relocation Meetings

Charleston-Kanawha Housing staff have begun meeting with residents of Washington Manor that will be affected by the demolition of units at the site.

Meetings are being held during the day and in the evening in an effort to accommodate everyone. The focus of the meeting is to discuss relocation options and the relocation process.

These meetings are being conducted in anticipation of HUD approval for demolition, which will most likely occur in September. Once the approval is received, residents will be able to receive payment for relocation. No one will be asked to move prior to that time.

CKHA is meeting now to give residents time to decide what relocation option they will choose. The options are:

- Remain in public housing
- Accept a Section 8 voucher
- Apply for a new tax credit unit
- Move to an apartment not managed by CKHA

As part of these meetings, we will be discussing the current appearance of your units, such as housekeeping, window dressings, trash, pets and other lease policies.
